


How much did you improve your knowledge about types and benefits of renewable energy?

How much did you improve your knowledge about the history and traditions of Siena?






How much did you improve your knowledge about sources of renewable energy in each partner country?





How do you appreciate the relevance of the activities in relation to your expectations?

























Overall score
